

HOW TO REPORT SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

FACT SHEET

Individuals and organizations in Nova Scotia have an obligation to report sexual misconduct when they have reasonable grounds to believe the conduct of a registrant or another regulated health care professional or unregulated care provider constitutes sexual misconduct.

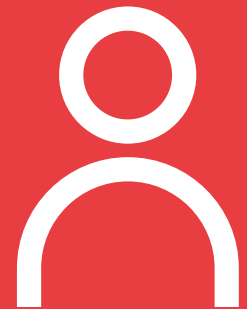

HOW TO REPORT SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

Sexual misconduct of a **registrant**



Report to NSCN

Sexual misconduct of other **regulated health care professional**



Report to their professional regulatory body

Sexual misconduct of **unregulated care provider**



Report to their employer

Registrants may be held accountable if they reasonably believe but do not report sexual misconduct of another registrant, regulated health care professional or unregulated care provider.
